Special Admissions Requirements for CNAS 1014:

- Have a high school diploma, or equivalent, and be able to legally work in the United States by the end of the CNAS 1014 course to obtain licensure and employment.
- College-level Reading & English placement OR ENGL 1113 with C or better.
- Submit to a substance abuse screening and criminal background check during the first week of class.
- Complete and submit proof of a negative tuberculosis (TB) skin test prior to clinical training.
- Students must comply with the Department of Long Term Care hour requirements for completion of 74 hours of theory and 16 hours of clinical experience.

Special Admissions Requirements for PHLB 1016:

- Be at least 18 years of age by time of completion.
- Have a high school diploma, or equivalent at the time of application.
- College-level Reading & English placement OR ENGL 1113 with C or better.
- Submit to a substance abuse screening and criminal background check during the first week of class.

Acceptance of electives in transfer toward baccalaureate degree requirements at out-of-state institutions is solely at the discretion of the receiving institution. Students planning to transfer elective credit to four-year institutions outside Arkansas should contact the ASU Mid-South Registrar's Office or the Admissions Office of the transfer institution before enrolling in an elective to verify transferability to specific institutions.
