magine a world where every adult, regardless of racial, social or economic disparities, has a college degree, certificate, industry certification, or other credential of value. These are the goals the cast of ASU Mid-South is working toward thanks to a collaboration with Complete College America (CCA) funded by Lumina Foundation. ASU Mid-South is one of twenty historically or predominantly Black community colleges from across the nation selected to participate in this project with CCA. This initiative seeks to establish a network of institutions committed to advancing expertise, sharing resources, and promoting culturally relevant learning to all Predominantly Black Community Colleges/Historically Black Community Colleges with the ultimate goal of increasing the number of adults of color earning credentials of value.

The project at ASU Mid-South involves team members from Academic Advising, Student Affairs, Enrollment Management, Career Services, and Institutional Research/Institutional Effectiveness. It complements the work ASU Mid-South is already engaged in through our Predominantly Black Institution (PBI) grant initiative.

among our stakeholders that includes the students
and communities that we presently serve," said
Gerar Pope, ASU Mid-South's Director of Title III PBI
Grant. Pope is heavily involved in the CCA initiative.
"From a more personal perspective, I think CCA has
revealed and confirmed to many of us that there
are many impactful things that ASU Mid-South is
presently doing, yet as with any endeavor there is
always room for growth."

Pope, along with Jeremy Reece, Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs and Michael Lejman, Associate Vice Chancellor of Institutional Research and Assessment, attended the CCA Conference in Atlanta in October. CCA's mission is to build a new system that restores the promise of higher education. According to the CCA website, "We can either reflect the racial, social, and economic injustices of society—or we can be an engine of equity, prosperity, and hope."


CCA has helped ASU Mid-South create a promise scholarship program, which is a last dollar scholarship to help ensure local students who want to attend ASU Mid-South are able to do so without financial concern. "We are seriously blessed to be able to participate in a number of these initiatives," Reece said.

Ashley Ruby is ASU Mid-South's project coach.

"I have enjoyed learning about ASU Mid-South, the students it serves and the institutional and project priorities," Ruby said. "Every action the team has taken through the lens of this project has been meaningful." One item we are proud of is the progress we've made with Academic Maps. Research demonstrates that quality Academic Maps at a higher education institution are an effective enrollment and persistence strategy. Our Maps feature clear education pathways with stackable credentials. Through this partnership with Complete College America, Greyhounds will continue to thrive!

he Arkansas General Assembly determined that in order to compete with an aggressive and effective 21st century economic development strategy, the state must start by properly evaluating and addressing the workforce education needs. Preparing and encouraging this region's Arkansans to pursue high-demand jobs, including those stemming from industry recognized credentials, career and technical certificates, associate degrees, and bachelor's degrees is essential to building a skilled and employment-ready workforce.

This fall, in response to local demand from Carvana, Ford Motor Company, Goodyear Commercial, and others, ASU Mid-South added an automotive component to its existing Diesel Maintenance Technology program. Primary changes to the curriculum included the revision of the program's existing Brake Systems course and the addition of introductory courses emphasizing safety and proper use of tools. The West Memphis School District and Arkansas' Office of Skills Development have pledged to assist with instructional and equipment costs related to providing this program in the college's Secondary Technical Center.

As a part of the comprehensive transportation/distribution program ASU Mid-South was also awarded a \$1 million Regional Workforce Grant by the Arkansas Division of Higher Education. These funds will be used in support of programs in Transportation, specifically truck driving. A portion of the funds were used to purchase a truck and trailer. The remaining funds will be directed to purchase an on-campus truck-driving range in close proximity to the Marion Berry Renewable Energy Center, which houses the Automotive/Diesel Technology Program.

Commercial Truck Driving provides students entry into a high-demand, high-wage career. The addition of this program, long sought-after in our community, will be a huge step forward in supporting our local transportation/distribution employers. These include Schneider, FedEx Freight, and Paschall Truck Lines, as well as city and county governments and local school districts, all of which are in need of individuals with CDL Class A or B licenses



While we celebrate the expansion of our transportation and distribution programs, we also highlight special recognition of Greg Mosley, Diesel Technology faculty member, ASU Mid-South alumnus, and former Secondary Technical Center Student, who was recently featured in an annual publication, "Arkansas Next", distributed each fall to every Arkansas student in grades 8-12. The publication encourages students to pursue education beyond high school. Greg is a living example of what it means to take advantage of the opportunities provided in high school, carry them to the next level, and ultimately turn them into a rewarding professional career.



On October 22, ASU Mid-South filed a letter of intent with the NJCAA, formally signaling its interest in expanding its athletics offerings to include baseball and softball as early as the 2023 Season. The athletics expansion will provide more opportunities to attract students to our campus. Student-athletes come to ASU Mid-South, perform well on the court and in the classroom, and then transfer on to continue playing and finish their degrees. The addition of baseball and softball will add diversity to campus by pulling in students from the region and other states.

"Lady Greyhound and Greyhound basketball has become an ASU Mid-South tradition," Jeremy Reece said. "Athletics brings people together and we are excited to expand in this area. Hopefully this is just the beginning."

he 2021-22 Greyhound Men's and Women's basketball teams put on incredible performances, finishing their regular seasons ranked second in conference standings. The women (17-9 overall and 8-2 in conference play) finished the season ranked 16th in NJCAA Division II standings. They also finished 3rd in home game attendance for Division II. The men (13-11 overall and 7-3 in conference play) finished out of the top 20 rankings nationally, but 5th in home game attendance.





ASU Mid-South has its first-ever NJCAA All-Academic Team member. Greyhound basketball forward Braxtyn McCuien was named to the 2021-22 NJCAA All-Academic First Team at the end of the season. McCuien is a native of Conway, Ark., and he finished his freshman year with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average. "It's a huge thing to me to be a Greyhound. Coach Parker always says we're in a fishbowl, so no matter where I go, I want to represent ASU Mid-South in the best way possible," McCuien said.



he Lady Greyhounds have begun a new era with an all-new team and head coach as Addie Lees takes the helm in her first year at ASU Mid-South after a successful four-year run at Kilgore College located in Kilgore, Texas, where she led the Lady Rangers to a 75-42 record and three 20-win seasons, culminating in a top 25 National ranking in 2021-22.

Lees, a Plainview, Texas native boasts a 100% graduation rate for her student-athletes, with each of her teams averaging a 3.15 grade-point average or above. Prior to her job at Kilgore college, Lees spent two years as Assistant Coach and Recruiting Coordinator at NCAA Division I Texas State University in San Marcos, Texas, where she was key in helping the Lady Bobcats achieve a WBI postseason tournament appearance.

In her student days, Lees played for NJCAA Region 5 Midland College for two seasons, while earning her Associate's degree, before finishing her career at NCAA Division II University of Arkansas at Monticello, where she earned her Bachelor's degree with Magna Cum Laude honors.

With no returning players from last year's 17-10 squad, Coach Lees began her duties in July and recruited 14 players for the 2022-23 season. The Lady Greyhounds begin Region 2 play in January with 10 games that conclude with the Region Tournament at home sites with the championship held March 6 at Harding University in Searcy, Ark.

egional labor shortages exist throughout our region. Arkansas Delta Workforce
Opportunities for Rural Communities
(ADWORC) is an initiative to increase the labor participation rate by preparing new entrants for the workforce, particularly persons from impoverished backgrounds, who are or have been incarcerated, and dislocated workers for jobs in high-demand fields.

This program provides skills training to individuals who may have been previously unemployed, underemployed, or have challenges in becoming employed. Funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Labor and Delta Regional Authority, ADWORC is an initiative of the Arkansas Delta Training and Education Consortium (ADTEC), a partnership of the five community colleges in eastern/northeastern Arkansas, and provides coursework and certifications in Work Ready Essentials, CPR/First Aid, Forklift Operations, and OSHA 10. Participants also have the opportunity to obtain the National Career Readiness Certification. This is one of the many opportunities that have been provided to residents of East Central Arkansas Community Correction Center (ECACCC) in West Memphis.

ASU Mid-South is proud to participate in this initiative, and even more proud to celebrate the success of the program and those staff and faculty members who've ensured the success in 2022.
